The Princess of Prussia

Victoria, Princess Royal, was the eldest child of Queen Victoria and Prince Albert. Born at Buckingham Palace in 1840, she became engaged to Prince Frederick William of Prussia when she was just 14, marrying him in 1858 when she was 17.

The marriage was both a love match as well as a political alliance to cement ties between England and Germany.

In 1861, on the death of King Frederick William IV of Prussia, Princess Victoria became Crown Princess of Prussia, becoming Empress of Prussia in 1888, sadly Frederick only reigned for 99 days, dying that same year. From then on she was known as The Empress Frederick, and, like her mother, dressed in mourning clothes for the rest of her life.

She died in 1901, just seven months after her mother
